BULLS ANXIOUS FOR SPRING PRACTICES TO BEGIN

University at Buffalo head football coach Jeff Quinn and his Bulls are focused on getting spring practices started on Wednesday, March 23rd.

The first matter at hand, of course, is improvement and beginning to sort out positions as August training camp approaches. However, more than anything, Quinn and the Bulls have moved forward after last season's disappointing campaign.

Quinn and his staff have focused on themselves, bringing in a pair of veteran offensive coaches in Alex Wood and Don Patterson, and developing the team through a seven-week winter conditioning period which has the Bulls bigger, stronger and more explosive. Buffalo is hungrier than ever to pursue its goal of competing for the MAC Championship.

To follow is a position-by-position look at the spring edition of the 2011 Bulls.

Quarterbacks

Returning starter(s): Alex Zordich, So., Jerry Davis, Jr.

Other Returnees: Rudy Johnson, R-Fr., Cory Jorgensen, Sr.

A critical position on any football team, it most certainly is the case for the Bulls who in Quinn's first season in the spread offense, did not get the kind of consistent play that the staff is looking for.

Jerry Davis started the season's first six games before true freshman *Alex Zordich* took the controls for four games before suffering a rib injury that ended his season, setting the stage for Davis to return for the final

two and a half games.

Davis had some spectacular moments, completing 142-of-298 passes for 1,753 yards and 16 touchdowns. However, the Fresno, CA native also threw 16 interceptions and lacked the consistency that the coaching staff was hoping for.

Davis throws the deep ball extremely well as evidenced by several big-play scores, including an 81-yard strike at Northern Illinois and a 60-yard bomb at Connecticut. He needs to continue to improve his overall mechanics and consistency to fulfill his strong potential.

Zordich, meanwhile, is a strong-armed, physical athlete who showed plenty of mettle in taking over the offense as a true freshman and showing glimpses of being an outstanding quarterback with both his arms and legs.

Zordich threw for 428 yards and a score and ran for two other touchdowns while getting starts against bowl-bound Temple and Ohio and MAC champion Miami. He is a strong runner who has a live arm, while still adjusting to the spread offense from a run-based high school attack. His football pedigree – his father Mike was an All-American at Penn State and Pro Bowl performer in the NFL – toughness and leadership skills have made an impression on the staff and his teammates.

Rudy Johnson, meanwhile, will get a long look this spring and brings excellent athleticism to the mix. An electric runner with good passing skills, he is the wild card in the mix after showing the staff some good signs while working on the offensive scout team last fall.



Cory Jorgensen, who returns from a shoulder injury, is a walk-on who gives solid depth and is a tremendous assist to the coaching staff with his knowledge of offense.

Quinn comments: "It's open competition at the quarterback position. We have four players that will be competing this spring – Davis, Zordich, Johnson and Jorgensen. Zordich and Davis are going to have an edge in experience and Rudy showed a lot of athleticism in our scout team work as well as in our freshmen scrimmages. I want to see more consistency leading our offense and taking great care of the football. The thing that really hampered us offensively was that we turned the ball over too much and lacked the ability to score points. That will change beginning this spring. The quarterback that can move the offense and score, will be the triggerman in the fall."

Running Backs

Returning starter: Branden Oliver, So.

Other Returnees: Jeffvon Gill, Jr., Josh Fuller, Jr., Brandon Murie, So., James Potts, R-Fr.,

While the offense struggled in many areas in 2010, the run game was of particular concern as UB averaged just 3.1 yards per carry and did not have a 100-yard rusher in any game in 2010.

That has led to an increased focus in the off-season by the coaching staff on running the ball, a concept that will clearly need better offensive line production as well. The coaching staff likes the mix of players they have returning and new offensive coordinator Wood and Quinn are excited to see how the running attack looks this spring.

Sophomore *Branden Oliver* and junior *Jefvon Gill* got the bulk of the carries last season and have different running styles. Oliver is a waterbug at 5-8 and nearly 200 pounds, who has the ability to make people miss, has good hands out of the backfield and is assignment sound play in and play out.

Gill is the biggest of the Bulls' backs at 6-0, 219, and led the team by averaging 4.3 yards per carry last season. He has displayed

a nice burst and power in his first two seasons but is still improving in the areas of blocking and consistency.

The staff is excited to see what highly-touted redshirt freshman *James Potts* will bring to the mix. Potts is lightning fast and has bulked up since arriving at UB after choosing the Bulls over scholarship offers from Big Ten and ACC programs. A pair of hard-nosed walk-ons, *Josh Fuller* and *Brandon Murie*, add depth and excel at special teams.

Quinn comments: "We are looking for a more consistent level of play at this position. With the two seniors (Ike Nduka and Brandon Thermilus) graduating it creates an opportunity to see where James Potts' development is right now. Its going to come down to Potts, Gill and Oliver and whoever is the most productive will get the majority of playing time. Our running backs must be dynamic runners, they have to protect our quarterback and be a threat in our passing game. We will be doing some new and exciting things to help our run game. The offensive line is a big part of this, but our running backs need to put the linemen on their blocks by making the right reads. It's going to be very competitive to see where they're at now it comes down to the fundamentals of football, take great care of the ball, be assignment sound – the running back position is a real critical spot for us. We need to get back to efficiently moving the ball on the ground."

Wide Receivers

Returning starters: Terrell Jackson, Sr., Marcus Rivers, Sr., Alex Neutz, So.

Other returnees: Ed Young, Sr., Saron Hood, Jr., Fred Lee, So., Derek Brim, So., Cordero Dixon, R-Fr., Devon Hughes, R-Fr., Aaron Huber, R-Fr., John Dunmore, R-Fr., Aaron Walters, R-Fr.,

The Bulls showed good productivity in the passing game last season and this position has the opportunity to shine in 2011 as every receiver who caught a pass last year returns.

Buffalo returns their top five receivers from a year ago – who combined to make 147 receptions and catch 17 touchdowns – in their second year in the spread. Leading the way are a pair of seniors, *Marcus Rivers* and *Terrell Jackson*. Rivers led Buffalo with 50 receptions for 690 yards (13.8 ypc) and tied for the team lead with five touchdown receptions. At 6-5, 218 pounds he has size that can create mismatches and had stretches of last season where he was dominant. His 81-yard catch and run at Northern Illinois displayed his rare blend of size and speed.

Jackson, meanwhile, is an all-everything player who registered 43 receptions for 397 yards and three touchdowns while also being named first-team All-MAC as a returner. Jackson led the conference by averaging 16.7 yards per punt return. A threat at both the intermediate and deep levels, Jackson is one of UB's most consistent performers.

Sophomore *Alex Neutz* emerged late in the

season to claim offensive team MVP honors. He finished the season with a team-high 15.9 yards per catch average while snaring 26 passes for 414 yards and four scores. Neutz made several circus catches in his freshman season and has the ability, at 6-3, to go above defenders to make spectacular grabs.

Nobody made more of his opportunities than senior *Ed Young*, who found himself in the end zone once every four times he caught the ball. Young finished with 20 receptions for 194 yards and tied for the team lead with five TD catches.

Sophomore *Fred Lee* (eight catches, 82 yards) and junior *Saron Hood* (4 catches, 33 yards) provide excellent veteran depth and Lee has the athletic abilities to also emerge this year. The coaching staff is anxious to see what the level of improvement and readiness is of several redshirt freshmen this spring.

Quinn comments: "We have the capability to be in five wide receivers all the way to one receiver with the multiple offense we run. We will be very specific in terms of creating those matchups. Neutz was the MVP of the offense last year and Terrell, Marcus and Eddie and Fred are all very talented players that add a lot of scoring capabilities. It's going to be great to see how much they have grown and developed in our offense. Offensively this is a key spot for us, we have three senior wide receivers who I expect their leadership to emerge both on and off the field. Our offensive production and their leadership go hand-in-hand. Their work ethic and practice habits in bringing this offense along are really going to be key."

Tight Ends

Returning starter: None

Other returnees: Aaron Connacher, Sr., Jake Reeder, So., Jimmy Gordon, So., Alex Dennison, So.

Buffalo graduated its regular starter last season in Mike Marr, but three of the four returnees – *Aaron Connacher*, *Jake Reeder* and *Jimmy Gordon* – saw significant game action in 2010. The fourth, *Alex Dennison*, has made a full conversion to tight end from quarterback and has a nice upside.

Reeder was emerging early in the season, making five catches for 52 yards, when a knee injury ended his season. That same injury will limit him this spring to mainly individual drills. Connacher is the biggest, and best blocker, in the group and also has good hands.

Gordon waited his turn last season as a redshirt frosh, but emerged late in the year due to injuries to post five catches for 54 yards. In all, Reeder, Gordon and Connacher combined to make 13 catches for 141 yards, a healthy 10.8 yard per catch average. Dennison, one of the team's best athletes, will have the spring to fully transition to the tight end position but has good size, strength and quickness.

Quinn comments: "Our focus is to find the type of player that can be both attached and detached from the offensive line. Then we need to find another guy that can play the "H" back position. Reeder won't be able to give us a lot of reps this spring (because of injury), but his off-field rehab has been solid. He has a great passion for the game so I know he will be back. Connacher is another solid competitor who has improved his strength and power. Alex made the move halfway through the season (to tight end) and this spring will be his chance to show us what he can do. Gordon hasn't had a lot of game experience, but he will help us in many ways. We have added a lot more to that position with Alex and Jimmy's development."



Offensive Line

Returning starters: Matt Ostrowski, Sr., Josh Violanti, Sr., Graham Whinery, Jr., Pat Wilson, So.

While Buffalo appears to have a nice mix of both young and veteran skill players, the success of the offense will no doubt hinge on improved play from an offensive line that was decimated by injuries last season.

Buffalo's coaching staff is intent on finding better balance between run and pass and they will rely on an offensive line that has several season veterans and a number of players who have a chance to add quality depth.

It starts up front with seniors *Josh Violanti*, a two-year starter, and *Matt Ostrowski*, who broke his leg in week three, starting a parade of injuries that hurt the unit's consistency and depth.





Josh Violanti is the prototypical coach on the line who is extremely intelligent and durable. He has gotten bigger in the off-season and will be counted on heavily as a senior leader. *Ostrowski* will not participate in contact drills this spring but is on the road to recovery and could develop into a premier MAC tackle this year, which he was on his way to last season before injury.

Two other starters return in junior *Graham Whinery*, who gives great flexibility as he can play, guard, center and even tackle, and sophomore tackle *Pat Wilson*, an excellent athlete, who continues to mature. Another player who has seen significant time, *Gokhan Ozkan*, is also recovering from an injury, but should be fine for summer camp. Sophomore *Jasen Carlson*, an All-WNY product, was productive as a true freshman, but also suffered injuries that kept him from contributing more. Carlson can play both center and guard and is both athletic and strong.

The coaching staff is very anxious to get a look at five new faces this spring. Redshirt freshmen *Andre Davis* (6-4, 315) and *Jeff Veinotte* (6-5, 337) both missed all of last fall to injury, but are ready to push for playing

time this spring, while *Jake Silas*, 6-7, 314, brings length and athletic ability. All three add major size to the offensive front.

Likewise, bringing size and depth are a pair of mid-year freshmen in Canadians *Dillon Guy* and *Gabriel Barbe*. Both bring a maturity that could allow them to see the field right away.

Quinn Comments: "The focus from year one to year two is the fact that we need to be more consistent with our effort in getting into our blocks, sustaining our blocks and finishing to the echo of the whistle. Overall our focus has been to get these guys bigger and more explosive so we can control the line of scrimmage. Three guys that we will really lean on are Violanti, Wilson and Whinery – who with *Ostrowski* going down in the third game – had to step up. We won't be able to see where Matt and G.O. (*Ozkan*) are until after spring. Pat (*Wilson*) will still be developed as our left tackle, he's had a good, solid winter. Violanti has had another solid off-season, and we will rely on him heavily at the center position. *Jake Silas* is a guy we look forward to seeing and *Barbe* and *Guy* have added some more depth. We have a big hole to replace in Peter Bittner, a four-year starter who was as solid as anyone in the MAC. Losing him to graduation is going to have to be absorbed by our veteran players."

Defense

Defensive Line

Returning starters: Steven Means, Jr.

In the Bulls 3-4 defense, the defensive line

will reload a bit with the graduation of senior starters Jerry Housey and Anel Montanez. However, Quinn and his defensive coordinator William Inge, like the mix of youth and veterans that will compete for playing time this spring. Quinn acknowledges that he and Inge will rely heavily on their front seven to allow for the transition from losing five senior defensive backs to graduation.

It starts with two-year starting defensive end *Steven Means*. The Grover Cleveland product continues to emerge as one of the MAC's best defensive ends, registering 50 tackles last season to go along with 8.5 tackles for loss and 4.5 sacks, while forcing two fumbles and recovering two others. Means, when combined with outside linebacker *Khalil Mack*, formed a dominating one-two punch for offensive lines to try to slow down. Means has 9.5 quarterback sacks in his first two seasons.

Senior nose guard *Richie Smith* seems poised for a breakout year. At 6-3, 289, Smith possesses excellent size and is also very nimble on his feet. In regular duty last year, the Pennsylvania native registered 24 tackles, including 2.5 for losses. Another senior, *Gordon DuBois*, will also look to crack the starting lineup at defensive end after recording a half-sack and an interception return for a score at Northern Illinois last year.

Junior *Terry Peden* adds solid depth with the ability to play both inside and out, as should JUCO transfer *Wyatt Cahill*, who enrolled in January.

The coaching staff is very excited about emerging youngsters like *Colby Way* and *Dalton Barksdale*, who should see significant action this spring to continue their growth. Way saw action in 11 games as a true freshman, making nine tackles and playing a valuable role on special teams, while Barksdale is a 6-4, 264-pound athlete with good

bloodlines. His older brother Joseph was an All-SEC selection at LSU who was invited to the NFL Combine.

Quinn Comments: “The seven weeks of winter conditioning has really allowed our young kids to show their competitive spirit. It’s a good mixture, we have eight guys graduating from the defensive side and I feel like our front seven will really give us the stability we need on the defensive side of the ball. We have to make sure our back end is supported...they have to control the line of scrimmage and put pressure on the quarterback and they are fully capable of doing that. Even though we lose Housey and Anel, Steven Means has seen a lot of playing time, DuBois has done a nice job and we should expect a lot of things out of Richie Smith this spring and fall...he is very reliable. Wyatt Cahill has come in with a good understanding of what we are trying to do on defense and there are a lot of great things in store for Dalton Barksdale and Colby Way.”

Linebackers

Returning starters: Khalil Mack, So., Jaleel Verser, Jr.

This unit has great experience and productivity in its outside linebackers but must replace starting inside linebackers Justin Winters and Raphael Akobundu from last year.

When both were healthy last year, *Khalil Mack* and *Jaleel Verser* formed a two-man wrecking crew at outside linebacker and Inge would love to have them together again this fall. Mack made several national All-Freshmen teams with a tremendous

breakout season.

The Fort Pierce, FL native was simply unblockable at times, making a plethora of big plays, including a team-leading 14.5 tackles for loss and 10 pass breakups. Mack finished with 68 tackles (40 solos) while adding 4.5 sacks, eight quarterback hurries and two forced fumbles.

An ankle injury cut Verser’s season short just when he was starting to flash the potential that the coaching staff has seen in him. At 6-6 and nearly 250 pounds, Verser creates mismatches and had 14 tackles, two for losses, a sack and a pair of pass breakups in limited duty last year.

The Bulls have tremendous depth and experience at outside linebacker as seniors *John Syty* and *Josh Copeland* and juniors *Imani Chatman* and *Dalonte Wallace* have all seen significant playing time in their careers and are standouts on special teams.

On the inside, senior *Fred Branch* will get a long look in spring ball. Branch, when healthy, has given UB good production, including 20 tackles last year. The staff will be happy to have *Scott Pettigrew* back from an ACL injury that cost him last year. The redshirt junior started most of his first two seasons before the injury and had 55 tackles and three fumble recoveries in 2009. *Mark Richardson* should also be in the hunt at inside backer, while redshirt freshman *Lee Skinner* also figures to be in the mix, while Syty can play both inside and out.

Quinn Comments: “Mack and Verser are dynamic players. They are big, strong and explosive players that should give us a lot of mismatches, whether its versus the running backs or offensive lines. We do have some holes to fill at inside linebacker with Raph (Akobundu) and Justin Winters graduating. It’s nice to get Scott Pettigrew back and Fred



Branch and Mark Richardson are excited to get their chance to prove they have the ability to compete at this level. Syty being able to play multiple positions helps us depth wise and we are looking forward to seeing our young guys like Skinner and Roberson compete this spring.”

Defensive Backs

No team in the country was likely more ravaged by graduation to its defensive backfield than the Bulls. UB lost All-MAC safeties Davonte Shannon and Domonic Cook as well as three-year starting cornerback Josh Thomas, a projected NFL draft choice and UB’s best cover corner. Also lost was cornerback Sherrod Lott, who started most of the season at the other corner position and has been a valuable nickel back throughout his



career.

Thus the Bulls will get extremely young very quickly on the back end. Heading into spring ball the cornerback spots appear most likely to be manned by sophomore *Carlos Lammons*, who saw action in 10 games last year with 19 tackles and a pass breakup, and Cincinnati transfer *Romel Dismuke*, who was part of the Bearcat program when Quinn and Inge were part of a staff that led UC to back-to-back BCS bowl games.

Also competing for cornerback spots will be senior *Joe Petit*, who has been a solid backup throughout his career, sophomore Najja Johnson, who saw action last year and redshirt freshmen *Cortney Lester*, *Dwelle Striggles* and *Keith Takeh*. All three are Floridians with good speed and pedigree, coming from excellent high school programs.

Quinn has moved Lester and former All-WNY performer *Adam Redden*, who both appeared ready to contribute at wide receiver this year, to the defensive backfield to add competition and depth. Redden will miss spring ball while healing from a knee injury suffered mid-year last season but is expected to compete at safety.

At safety, UB may have found its next standout in *Okoye Houston*, who played as a true frosh and did not look out of place when pressed into service. The South Carolina native made 15 tackles, including one for loss, in his first season. Houston figures to battle with three upperclassmen, senior *Alan Hayes* and juniors *Isaac Baugh* and *Ray Anthony Long*. All three possess good speed with Long being the biggest at 215 pounds. All four players will also be crucial to UB's special teams as well.

Quinn comments: "This year's group will be the ones who will have to replace four graduating seniors (Shannon, Cook, Thomas and

Lott). We wanted to move the most talented guys we have to positions where they can help us...that's why Redden and Lester give us the best chance to be successful back there. It will be a critical off-season for this group and Coach (Ernest) Jones and (Mike) Dietzel are going to have to work hard to get these guys ready to step in and be productive for our defense to continue to improve. Lester's move to defense gives us a very explosive, talented guy there and Romel (Dismuke) is a guy that has all the physical capabilities of being a top corner at this level. In addition, Joe Petit and Alan Hayes are going into their final season of competition and we should expect them to challenge for a starting spot. Long, Okoye and Baugh have the skills, now they need to go out and display their abilities. Lammons and Johnson have had field experience, including special teams, and their opportunity will be seized when they are making plays. It will be exciting to see what Striggles and Sherry can do after being redshirted this fall."

Special Teams

Buffalo returns all of its key special teamers with the exception of all-time leading scorer A.J. Principe at placekicker, as well as his backup John Rachuna.

Junior *Jacob Schum*, who shook off some early-season inconsistency, averaged 38.5 yards per punt, including 13 fair catches and 13 inside the 20, and senior *Peter Fardon*, who has 41 kicks inside the 20 in his career, will continue to duel for the punting position. Fardon will also serve as the placekicker this spring, auditioning for the role

vacated by Principe.

Quinn Comments: "I like where we are with special teams, as we bring back the majority of our key guys. Fardon and Schum will battle it out for the punting duties again and Fardon has worked extremely hard at taking on the placekicking role. He will be evaluated for that position along with incoming signee Patrick Clarke."

Overall thoughts: "These 15 practices are crucial for us to take the next steps to becoming a MAC championship contender. You win by recruiting talented players who have a passion and competitive spirit for this great game. We are about developing and creating a culture of excellence both on and off the field. Adding Alex and Don to our coaching staff has made a positive impact on the offensive side to compliment a solid defensive staff. I look forward to seeing where we are at when the pads are on this spring. There are no shortcuts: hard work, determination and giving great effort are the key to winning."

Head Coach Jeff Quinn



Jeff Quinn begins his second season at the helm of the University at Buffalo football program. The Bulls finished 2-10 in his first season, with a 1-7 mark in MAC play. Despite the record, the Bulls boasted one of their best defenses in their Division I history in 2010 as defensive backs Davonte Shannon and Domic Cook earned All-MAC First Team honors, while linebacker Khalil Mack was named to *Phil Steele's* 2010 Postseason All-Freshman Team.

Quinn was introduced as the 24th head coach in the history of the University at Buffalo football program by Director of Athletics Warde Manuel on Dec. 22.

Quinn has produced record-breaking offenses throughout his 27-year college coaching tenure and has won conference and national championships at his last three stops, including five conference crowns in the past eight seasons.

Said University President John B. Simpson, "I am very pleased that Jeff Quinn will be joining the University at Buffalo. His extensive coaching experience and proven leadership skills make him a great choice as our program continues to gain national stature. From my conversations with Jeff, I know that he shares UB's institutional commitment to excellence and that he will work hard to help our student-athletes succeed in the classroom as well as on the playing field.

"I commend Warde Manuel for assembling a strong, competitive pool of candidates, and I

enthusiastically endorse his choice of Jeff Quinn as UB's next head football coach," said Simpson.

"I am elated to welcome Coach Quinn to Buffalo and look forward to the continued growth of our program under his leadership," said Manuel. "We have proven that this program can win championships and with Coach Quinn's pedigree and track record of success, that should become an annual expectation for our football team.

"I believe that we have hired one of the sharpest offensive minds in all of college football and someone who will bring great excitement to our program," said Manuel. "In addition, Coach Quinn has proven himself as an outstanding recruiter both nationally and within the Mid-American Conference. He has coached and won at every level and truly cares about the development of student-athletes as young men and football players. For all these reasons and more, I am anxious to see what the next chapter of UB football brings."

As offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Cincinnati for the past three seasons, Quinn has helped the Bearcats compile a 33-6 record, including a 12-0 record this year and a national No. 4 ranking heading into the Sugar Bowl meeting with defending national champion Florida.

Quinn was named one of five finalists for the 2009 Broyles Award, which is given to the nation's top assistant coach. Unranked in preseason polls, Cincinnati's undefeated regular season catapulted the Bearcats to No. 3 in the BCS standings and earned them an invitation to the Allstate Sugar Bowl, the school's second consecutive BCS game. UC set numerous school records in 2009, including those for wins (12), road wins (6), consecutive regular season wins (18), points (495), passing yards (3,844), fewest fumbles (10) and fewest turnovers (10).

Behind Quinn's offensive line, the Bearcats have had an individual top the 100-yard plateau in six of the last eight games and eight out of 12 games overall. UC has topped 200-yards rushing on three occasions and has set the school record for points and touchdowns. Offensive tackle Jeff Linkenbach was a midseason selection to the SI.com all-America squad.

UC leads the nation in passing efficiency (166.19) despite using five different quarterbacks through the course of the season. The Bearcats rank sixth in passing offense (320.3), scoring offense (39.8), and total offense (464.3) and 10th in sacks al-

lowed (0.9) behind Quinn's coordination of the offense.

Eleven UC student-athletes were honored as all-BIG EAST selections, including four out of Quinn's five starting offensive linemen. Chris Jurek (1st), Alex Hoffman (2nd), Jason Kelce (2nd), and Linkenbach (2nd) earned all-BIG EAST honors in 2009.

No stranger to the Mid-American Conference and its recruiting footprint, Quinn served as associate head coach and offensive coordinator at Central Michigan prior to his stint at Cincinnati and helped lead the Chippewas to the 2006 MAC title. He served as interim head coach for Central Michigan's 31-14 victory over Middle Tennessee in the 2006 Motor City Bowl prior to joining the UC staff.

He arrived at CMU in 2004 after 15 seasons at Grand Valley State. He was part of the staff that led the Lakers to back-to-back national championships in 2002 and 2003. The 2001 Laker offense averaged 600.8 yards and set an NCAA record by averaging 58.4 points per game.

During his career, Quinn has coached 12 offensive linemen who have played in the professional ranks, including first, fourth, fifth, and seventh round NFL Draft choices, as well as 22 players who have earned All-America status. In 2008, Quinn mentored Offensive guard Trevor Canfield, who was an Associated Press Second-Team All-America selection, the first UC offensive lineman to earn a spot on the AP team since Bill Shalosky in 1952.

He is a 1984 graduate of Elmhurst College where he was a two-sport standout in football and wrestling. Quinn was twice named Student-Athlete of the Year at Elmhurst. He was inducted into Elmhurst's Athletic Hall of Fame in 1993.

Quinn earned a master of arts degree from DePauw in 1986 and an educational leadership master's degree endorsement from GVSU in 2000.

He and his wife Shannon have two sons, Kyle and Ryan. Kyle serves as the undergraduate student representative to the UC Board of Trustees. Ryan is a wrestler at Central Michigan.





Alex Wood

Offensive Coordinator/Wide Receivers
Iowa '79
First Season at Buffalo

Alex Wood begins his first season as offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach at Buffalo.

Wood brings with him over 30 years of experience at the Division I level and he has also served as a coordinator in the National Football League. He spent the past season as wide receivers coach at Miami University where he helped the RedHawks claim a Mid-American Conference championship a year removed from winning just one game.

His coaching career is highlighted by tremendous success at the highest levels of both college and professional football. From 1989-93 he was part of Dennis Erickson's staff for the Miami Hurricanes, coaching the running backs, while helping the Canes to a pair of National Championships (1989 and 1991) and a perfect 12-0 season in 1991.

Wood has also been a wide receiver coach in the NFL with the Cincinnati Bengals, a quarterback coach for the Minnesota Vikings and the offensive coordinator of the Arizona Cardinals.

After serving as offensive coordinator for two seasons at Wake Forest (1993-94), he was named as the head football coach at James Madison University. Wood led the Dukes to an 8-4 record in his first season including a trip to the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs. In his four-year tenure at JMU, Wood compiled a record of 23-22.

Wood moved into the pro ranks in 1999, when he was hired by Dennis Green as the quarterbacks coach of the Minnesota Vikings. He spent four seasons with the Vikings' organization. In his first year with the team, the Vikings selected Daunte Culpepper in the first round of the 1999 NFL Draft. By Culpepper's second season, the young star not only took over the starting quarterback job but earned a start for the National Football Conference (NFC) in the Pro Bowl. He tied for the NFL lead with 33 passing touchdowns and ranked second in the NFC with 3,937 yards. Culpepper led the Vikings to the NFC Central title and a spot in the conference championship game.

In 2001, Culpepper was lost to a season-ending injury but still managed to finish third in the NFC in completion percentage (64.2). The Culpepper-Wood combination was back at it again in 2002. Culpepper spearheaded the NFL's second-ranked offensive unit and in the process the Vikings' quarterback finished second in the NFC in passing yardage (3,853) for the second time in Wood's tenure.

Wood was named wide receivers coach by the Cincinnati Bengals in 2003. In his one year in Cincinnati, Wood coached two players in the top 10 of receiving yards in the AFC (Chad Johnson and Peter Warrick). Johnson led the AFC with 1,355 yards on 90 receptions. He also had 10 touchdown receptions.

In 2004, Wood rejoined Green on the staff of the Arizona Cardinals. Wood served one season as the offensive coordinator for the Cardinals, overseeing the offensive staff and handling play-calling responsibilities.

He spent the 2006-07 seasons as the passing game coordinator at the University of Arkansas and ultimately ended up back in the Midwest helping the RedHawks of Miami become the first team in Division I history to go from one victory to double digit wins.

Wood is a native of Massillon, Ohio, and was a standout football player and wrestler at Washington High School. He and his wife, Rosa, have three children--Jerrel, Alex and Natalie. His son Alex is the defensive coordinator at Wayne (NE) State College.



William Inge

Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers
Iowa '96
Second Season at Buffalo

William Inge begins his second season with the Bulls, serving as UB's defensive coordinator and linebackers coach.

The Bulls' defense flourished in his first season. The Bulls ranked 32nd in the nation in total defense and featured a pair of first-team All-MAC defensive backs in Davonte Shannon and Domonic Cook. Shannon finished his career with a school record 461 tackles. Buffalo ranked second in the MAC in pass defense in 2010.

He spent the last two seasons working with the linebackers coach at Cincinnati.

In each of his two seasons with the Bearcats, the top two tacklers on the team were linebackers. Prior to arriving at Cincinnati, Inge spent two seasons as the linebackers coach at San Diego State. While with the Aztecs, he mentored leading tackler Russell Allen to All-Mountain West Conference honors.

In 2005, Inge was the defensive line coach at Colorado where he helped lead the Buffaloes to the Big 12 North Division title and advance to the Big 12 championship game.

In 2001, Inge was hired as a defensive assistant at Northern Iowa. Over his four seasons with the Panthers, he was elevated to co-defensive coordinator and special teams coordinator. Inge was a four-year letterwinner at Iowa where he earned a bachelor's and master's degree.

Inge lists winning the outright Big East Championship as the proudest moment in his professional career. He lists his hobbies as drag racing, hunting, camping, fishing and reading.

He believes the University at Buffalo is a great atmosphere for higher learning, athletic development and competition and social development. The motto that reflects his life is "Don't quit and never settle for anything but the best."

He and his wife Rae have three children, Taelor, Isaiah and Keara.

Second Season at Buffalo

Ernest Jones enters his second season as UB's Associate Head Coach and coaches the Bulls' cornerbacks. He also serves as recruiting coordinator for the Bulls and oversee the "Bulls in the Community" program.

In his first season, Jones coached a secondary that helped Buffalo rank second in the MAC in pass defense. Josh Thomas had a stellar senior campaign and was invited to the NFL Combine.

He was the director of player services and running backs coach at Cincinnati in 2009 after spending the 2008 season at Alcorn State.

Jones was the running backs coach at Cincinnati in 2007 as well as two seasons at Central Michigan. He helped develop a Central Michigan rushing attack that averaged 127.9 yards per game.

Jones also had coaching stints at Concordia, Kentucky State and Oberlin.

Second Season at Buffalo**

Jappy Oliver enters his second season as defensive line coach. In his first season, he coached a defensive line that had 23.5 tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks.

Oliver came to Buffalo after spending four years at Notre Dame as the Irish defensive line coach and boasts over 30 years of collegiate coaching experience.

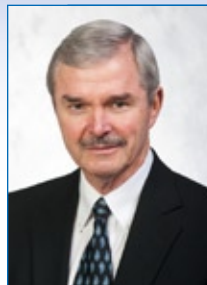
From 2005-08, Oliver helped the growth of Irish defensive ends Victor Abiamiri and Chris Frome as well as defensive tackles Derek Landri and Trevor Laws. Abiamiri was a second-round pick in the 2007 NFL draft by the Philadelphia Eagles, while Landri was chosen that same year in the fifth round by the Jacksonville Jaguars. Laws was drafted by the Eagles in the second round of the 2008 draft and became the earliest Irish defensive tackle selected since Bryant Young was taken in the first round 14 years earlier. Frome was signed the day after the '07 draft as an undrafted free agent by the Chicago Bears and went to camp with the then-defending NFC champions. Oliver will also serve as the team's pro liaison.

Oliver spent 2003-04 as defensive line coach under former Irish head coach Lou Holtz at South Carolina, teaming with former Irish defensive coordinator Rick Minter to achieve a noteworthy turnaround on the defensive side in 2004 as the Gamecocks finished with a national ranking of 20th in total defense (315.18 yards per game).

Oliver previously served on the staff of Air Force's Fisher DeBerry for eight seasons from 1995 through 2002, helping the Falcons to five postseason bowl appearances including wins in the Oahu Bowl (1998) and the Silicon Valley Bowl (2000).

Oliver was a standout athlete at Southwestern High School in Flint, Mich., earning all-city and all-district accolades in both football and basketball. He was the city's athlete of the year in 1973 and captained teams in football, basketball and baseball.

He has one daughter, Candace, and a son, Justin.



Don Patterson

**Quarterbacks
Army '73
First Season at Buffalo**

Don Patterson begins his first season as quarterbacks coach at Buffalo.

Patterson has a long and decorated coaching career, including tremendous success as a head coach at the Football Championship Series (FCS) level with Western Illinois. Patterson spent 10 seasons at Western Illinois, compiling a 62-45 overall record before illness forced him to step away from coaching for a year.

Patterson led the Leathernecks to three playoff berths, a pair of Gateway Football Conference titles and a No. 1 national ranking during his tenure. In his decade as head coach, Patterson produced 108 all-conference honorees, 34 academic all-conference selections, 59 All-Americans, including two consensus all-Americans, and two academic All-Americans.

Patterson came to Western Illinois after a 20-year run with famed Iowa head coach Hayden Fry, part of a coaching tree that includes Wisconsin's Bret Bielema, Iowa's Kirk Ferentz, Oklahoma's Bob Stoops and Arizona's Mike Stoops.

During his tenure at Iowa, the Hawkeyes appeared in 14 bowl games, including three Rose Bowls. The 1985 Iowa team was ranked No. 1 in the nation for five weeks, en route to a school-record 10 wins.

Under Patterson's guidance, the Iowa offense was explosive, leading the Big Ten in rushing (217.0 yards/game) and scoring (34.3 points/game) while finishing second in pass efficiency in 1997. Iowa finished the 1997 campaign ranked eighth in the nation in rushing offense and ninth in scoring, and had its highest pass efficiency ranking of any Iowa team since 1985.

Patterson was instrumental in Iowa's success, making the Hawkeyes one of only three Big Ten teams (also Ohio State and Michigan) to play in 14 bowl games during his tenure. Iowa appeared in the Rose Bowl after the 1981, 1985 and 1990 seasons, and made eight consecutive bowl appearances from 1981-88. The success of the Hawkeyes was immediate upon Patterson's arrival with Fry, evidenced by a Rose Bowl berth in their third season (1981), which was Iowa's first Rose Bowl appearance since 1958. Iowa ranked third among Big Ten teams in victories from 1979-98, and was one of three Big Ten teams to win more than 100 games between 1984-98.

From 1979-98 the Hawkeyes produced 38 first-team all-Big Ten selections, as well as six special teams first-teamers. Six Hawkeyes were first round NFL draft picks while five others were chosen in the second round and seven more in the third. Patterson directly coached five of Iowa's top seven career receivers, with the other two playing during his time. Prior to being named offensive coordinator, Patterson coached the Iowa tight ends - two of which, Marv Cook and Jonathan Hayes, enjoyed lengthy NFL careers.

Patterson was the last member of Fry's original Hawkeye staff. His association with Fry began in 1978 as an assistant at North Texas State coaching the defensive secondary. He joined Fry, serving in the same capacity, at Iowa in 1979. He served as recruiting coordinator in 1980 before coaching tight ends in 1981, a segment he coached until he began instructing quarterbacks and receivers in 1989.

The 1973 West Point graduate served on the cadet honor committee and was named to the highest-ranking cadet staff while at the Academy. He and his wife, Lisa, have a daughter, Brooke, who earned her doctorate in pharmacy from Purdue University.





Adam Shorter

**Offensive Line/Run Game Coordinator

Second Season at Buffalo**

Adam Shorter begins his second season coaching the offensive linemen. He is also the Bulls' run game coordinator.

He served in the same position at Delaware State in 2009.

He spent 2008 at Alcorn State, where he was in charge of the offensive line and tight ends. While with the Braves, Shorter was instrumental in the success of 2008 All-Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) offensive lineman Bronson Carvalho.
